



## Student Engagement & Enrichment Programs – 2024

At Al Iman College, we continue to prioritise the development of well-rounded students through experiences that extend beyond the classroom. Grounded in Islamic values, our student engagement initiatives are thoughtfully designed to support holistic development spiritually, intellectually, emotionally, physically and socially.

In 2024, students participated in a diverse range of enrichment programs designed to foster confidence, creativity, teamwork, and resilience. These included excursions, incursions, outdoor camps, wellbeing initiatives and engaging competitions across all year levels.

These programs were strategically aligned with curriculum outcomes and provided meaningful opportunities for students to connect with the wider world and live out their faith in action.

### **Outdoor Activities & Camps**






#### **Incursions**












Figure 4: displays student satisfaction with the Quality of Teaching per domain at Al Iman College against the ISV benchmark.




Figure 10: displays student satisfaction with the Quality of Teaching per domain by gender at Al Iman College compared to statistically similar schools.

## Student Satisfaction with Quality of Teaching compared to similar schools:




Figure 6: displays student satisfaction with the Quality of Teaching per domain at Al Iman College compared to statistically similar schools.

## Parent Satisfaction Survey Overall Parent Satisfaction





Figure 3: displays overall parent satisfaction per domain for Al Iman College compared to the ISV benchmark.
