Benefits of Staying in the State of Wudhū

Purification of the internal soul is not just encouraged by Allah * and his Messenger * rather striving to attain it, is the purpose of a Muslim's life, and its attainment is a source of success and salvation for both the worlds. Allah * has stated:

قد أَفْلَحَ مَنْ زَكَّهَا

He has succeeded who has purified it (soul). [Quran: 9:91]

Imam Ghazālī نَحِمَّهُ الله has stated: Purification has an order, which is [firstly]: purification of the apparent from impurity and wickedness, then [secondly]: purification of the limbs from crime and sins, then [thirdly]: purification of the heart from blameworthy mannerisms, then [fourthly] purification of Sir (the inner secret self) from all except Allah [®].

This means purification of the internal soul is not possible without the purification of the external body. The Prophet 🗯 said:

"External purification is half of faith" (Muslim).

Similarly, Allah [®] has made purification of some limbs, which is known as wudhū, a prerequisite for prayer. He [®] states:

"O you who believe, when you rise for Salah, (prayer) wash your faces and your hands up to the elbows and make Mash (wiping by hands) of your heads and (wash) your feet up to the ankles. If you are in a state of major impurity, cleanse yourselves well (by taking bath).(Quran 5:6)"

The Prophet [®] has also stated:

"Salah is not accepted without wudhū (purification)." (Muslim)

The Arabic word فِضُوْء wudhū is derived from وَضُاءَة wadhā'ah, which means beauty and cleanliness. The washing of the limbs for prayer is called wudhū because it cleans the washer and beautifies him.

Islam has given extreme importance to wudhū, and multiple benefits have been mentioned for the one who consistently remains in the state of wudhū. Consider the following benefits:

1) Wudhū wipes out all the minor sins committed by the limbs.

The Messenger of Allah (ﷺ)said:

"During the time when a Muslim, or a believer performs wudhū, when he washes his face every sin which he committed with his eyes, is washed away from his face with water, or with the last drop of water; when he washes his hands, every sin which is committed by his hands is washed away from his hands with the water, or with the last drop of water; and when he washes his feet, every sin his feet committed is washed away with the water, or with the last drop of water; until he finally emerges cleansed of all his sins." (Muslim)

- 2) Wudhū has been made a sign through which the Prophet will recognise his nation and serve them a drink from the pool of Kauthar, and whoever drinks from it will never again feel thirsty.
- 3) <u>The limbs of those who consistently perform wudhū will be radiant on the day</u> <u>of resurrection.</u>

The Messenger of Allah (ﷺ)said:

I would love that we see our brothers." The Companions said, "O Messenger of Allah! Are not we your brothers?" He said, "You are my Companions, but my brothers are those that have not come yet." They said, "O Messenger of Allah! How will you recognize those of your nation that have not come yet?" He said, "Do you not consider that if a man has horses that are white-footed with white foreheads among horses which are pure jet black, will he not recognize his own horses?" They said, "Certainly, O Messenger of Allah!" He said, "They (my followers) will come with bright faces and white limbs because of Wudu'; and I will arrive at the pool (of Kauthar) ahead of them (to give them to drink from it). (Muslim)"

4) It is a source of entering Paradise from any of the eight doors one wills.

The Messenger of Allah ﷺsaid:

"Whoever of you performs Wudhu' carefully and then says:

أَشْهُدُ أَنْ لاَّ إِلَهَ إِلاَّ اللهُ وَحْدَهُ لاَ شَرِيْكَ لَهُ، وَأَشْنُهَدُ أَنَّ مُحَمَّدًا عَبْدُهُ وَرَسُوْلُهُ

I testify that there so none worthy of worship except Allah Alone, He has no partners and that Muhammad sis His slave and Messenger, the eight gates of Jannah are opened for him. He may enter through whichever of these gates he desires (to enter). (Nasai)"

5) The one that consistently remains in the state of wudhū is loved by Allah 🕸 .

إِنَّ ٱللَّهَ يُحِبُّ ٱلتَّؤْبِينَ وَيُحِبُّ ٱلْمُتَطَهِّرِين:Allah ﷺ has stated

"Indeed, Allah loves those who are constantly repentant and loves those who purify themselves." (Quran: 2:222)

6) <u>Renewing one's wudhū is a source of multiple rewards.</u>

The Messenger of Allah *said*:

"Whoever performs wudhū while he is already in the state of purification, ten deeds are written for him." (Abū Dāwūd, Tirmizī & Ibn Mājah)

7) <u>The one who constantly remains in the state of wudhū will not feel lazy to</u> <u>perform righteous deeds.</u>

The Messenger of Allah *said*:

"When any one of you sleeps, Satan ties three knots at the back of his neck. He recites this spell at every knot: 'You have a long night, so sleep.' If he awakes and remembers Allah, one knot is loosened. If he performs Wudhu', the (second) knot is loosened; and if he performs prayer, (all) knots are loosened. He begins his morning in a happy and refreshed mood; otherwise, he gets up in bad spirits and sluggish state." (Bukhari & Muslim)

8) The one constantly in the state of wudhū will be able to meet his Creator in the state of wudhū guaranteeing him the reward of martyrdom.

It has been reported; "The state that you live in, is the state in which you will die".

Allāmah Ibn Ābidīn زَحِمَّهُ الله (A.H 1252) in his book "**Rad ul Muhtar"** الم الم الم has listed the occasions when it is **Fard** (Obligatory), **Wajib** (Compulsory), **Sunnah** and **Mustahab** (liked, preferred) to be in the state of **wudhū**:

Fardh Occasion: When praying Salāh

Wajib Occasions: When touching a script of the Quran and performing Tawāf (circumambulation of Kabah)

Sunnah Occasion: Before sleeping

Some of the Mustahab (liked, preferred) occasions are:

- After waking up from sleep
- After lying, backbiting, speaking immorally or laughing out loud
- After washing a dead body or carrying it
- Renewing wudhū at the time of every prayer
- Before taking a bath from Janābah major impurity
- Before eating, drinking, and sleeping for the who is in the state of major impurity
- When angry
- When reading an Islamic book
- When learning or teaching Islamic knowledge and Hadith
- When engaging in any form of remembrance of Allah *

The level of importance that Islam gives to **wudhū** can easily be gauged from the abovementioned virtues. These are a few of the many benefits of wudhū pertaining to the two worlds. **One should strive to always remain in the state of purification** in his life so that he may reap its benefits and virtues.

FIVE REASONS TO CULTIVATE A LOVE OF READING IN STUDENTS

1.Reading Expands Vocabulary: Reading exposes students to many new words that they must find out to learn the meaning, which increases their ability to express thoughts effectively. This in turn forms a platform to build vocabulary words that encourages students to express themselves confidently during their writing, reading, and speaking. Effective communication is the key in being successful in



learning and teaching. Students who develop communication skills feel confident in their ability to write, read and speak, and can advocate for other fellow students.

2. Reading Improves Theory of Mind. Theory of mind from the reading context refers to the ability to attribute beliefs, desires, emotions and share knowledge with others. Since different people have different understanding from different perspective. or interpretations, this skill helps students to empathize and understand others by exposing themselves to different situations through reading. Being empathic towards others acts as a key component to challenge students to be curious about the feeling of others and find ways to show that they care by expressing their feelings.

3. Reading sharpens the memory: Comprehending reading requires students to be able to engage their brains by collecting different words, scenes, and characters in the book to create and present the full story. Reading and writing are always associated with recalling and building on previously acquired knowledge. Reflecting on previous knowledge helps develop knowledge on a global context. These acquired skills go beyond language and can support learning and understanding all the other subjects from the global perspective.

4. Reading increases knowledge: Books are available in various languages and in many different levels in all the subjects. The more students read, the more information and knowledge they acquire and build concrete foundation, ready to challenge the competitive world and prepared to take up the new and challenging tasks. It also helps students to explore new ideas and enhances their literacy and numerary skills.

5. Reading enhances imagination: Reading is great way of entertainment; it allows

them to step into the new world and place themselves into the place of "Protagonist". Engaging students' imagination engages them in their own world of new cultures.
