

### Kinder Group B

At ELC, Kindergarten during National Recycling Week, we looked into how we can respect our resources by lowering the demand for new materials, reusing high-quality second-hand things, and recycling. Reducing waste not only keeps valuable materials out of landfills, but it also helps the environment by lowering greenhouse gas emissions and reducing the need for new resources. At home and in the workplace, reducing and reusing can help us save money.

With the children, we conducted a group conversation about how important it is to exercise the three R's (Reduce, Reuse and Recycle). Then we read a book called "Recycling is Fun" and gave each children template to draw on.









# **Western Water Digital Presentation**

#### Kinder group A and C

This term we had a Zoom incursion run by the Western Water Education Program. It was a helpful session that allowed the children to learn about water.

In this Zoom session, the children were participating in discussions about where water comes from, how we use water, and how we can save water. The children practiced minimising water wastage by counting from 1 up till 5 before closing the tap. After they finished the incursion, the children made their own watering can using recycling plastic bottles to use it outside in the garden.



# Why Save Water



Did you know that less than 1% of all the water on Earth can be used by people? The rest is salt water (the kind you find in the ocean) or is permanently frozen and we can't drink it, wash with it, or use it to water plants.

As our population grows, more and more people are using up this limited resource. Therefore, it is important that we use our water wisely and not waste it.

The children were interested about the outdoor environment, so we took them outside to water the plants and learn about different textures and colours of leaves and flowers. Tips to get ready for big school

- Spend time with relatives or family friends so your children can develop a growing sense of independence and capacities for communicating needs with other adults.
- Go for a visit to the school before the first day so children can familiarize themselves with the school and have an idea of where they will be attending.
